The book has three foci: Andrew Carnegie and the Mellon Family as founders; the administrations of the University's eight presidents, and five snapshot chapters of the school, particularly student life, at twenty-year intervals beginning in 1907-1909. Written by Professor Emeritus Edwin (Ted) Fenton, this rich history immerses readers in the life of the University throughout its 10 decades of growth and achievement.

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
