COMMON MISTAKES TO AVOID IN DARTMOUTH ESSAYS

EXCESSIVE FLATTERY OR GENERIC PRAISE

OVERUSING CLICH S AND STOCK PHRASES

CLICH? S DILUTE ORIGINALITY AND MAKE ESSAYS LESS MEMORABLE. WRITERS SHOULD AVOID TIRED EXPRESSIONS AND STRIVE FOR FRESH, PERSONAL LANGUAGE THAT REFLECTS THEIR UNIQUE VOICE.

NEGLECTING GRAMMAR AND STYLE

POOR GRAMMAR, SPELLING MISTAKES, AND AWKWARD PHRASING DETRACT FROM THE ESSAY'S PROFESSIONALISM. THOROUGH PROOFREADING AND EDITING ARE ESSENTIAL TO PRESENT POLISHED, ERROR-FREE WRITING.
